Dear Parents and Guardians,

Families looking for extra tickets (in addition to the five given to each senior) or handicapped seating tickets may have their student sign up on the waiting lists in the Main Office. A limited number of extra tickets and special seating tickets are available and will be distributed in pairs on a first come basis after rehearsal 6/21.



Vehicles with handicapped parking tags may park by the varsity baseball field and concession stand. To access that parking, please proceed to the rear entrance of the school, on Gallup Hill Road, and drive up through the gate at the top of the hill. There will be attendants to direct you to a space.



Guests with limited mobility may be dropped at the Ag Circle, which is to the far right as you face the front of the school. From there, guests will be transported by golf cart to the back of the school. Golf carts are running in a perpetual loop, so do not be alarmed if you do not see a cart present when you arrive.



There is ample parking around the campus:

- Front parking lot (lined spaces and grassy expanses)
- Lower football practice field (accessible off Gallup Hill Road; parking attendant)
- Lower baseball field (accessible from the rear entrance; parking attendant)
- Grass embankments of Gallup Hill Road along the side & rear

(If you park in the grass anywhere on or around campus, please pull in perpendicular to the road, as though into a parking space, to maximize room.)



Please <u>do not park</u> on the actual street of Gallup Hill Road. Pull fully onto the grass to maintain an entirely clear roadway for local traffic and emergency vehicles. Please <u>do not park</u> on Greystone Court, located directly behind the school. They are good neighbors, not a parking lot!

Please <u>do not park</u> behind the AgriScience wing. That creates an unsafe setting for our graduates because they line up back there.

INFORMATION REGARDING FALL 2018 SPORTS

Every sports season necessitates some up-to-date medical form be submitted to participate. All athletes are required to have a complete physical annually. The period of time between last year's physical and the next year's physical should be no more than 13 months. We allow the extra month to accommodate insurance as well as scheduling issues.

PLEASE NOTE: We will not have a copy of the blue Health Assessment Record (Blue Form) if a copy has not been turned into the LHS nurse's office. The physician's office does not send this to us.

- *If your athlete has a current, complete physical done within the 13 month time frame, he/she will need a parent/guardian to complete an INTERIM SPORTS form to be eligible to play a sport in the Fall of 2018. This needs to be turned into the nurse's office BEFORE tryouts begin.
- * If your athlete does not have a current, complete Health Assessment on file here at the LHS nursing office, he/she will need to either:
 - 1. Get a copy of the Blue physical form from your doctor's office. Make sure the physical is within the 13 month time period and not outdated. Make sure the parent section (page 1) is completed and signed and current.
- 2. Schedule a physical examination appointment with the child's physician **BEFORE** tryouts begin. Turn this Health Assessment form into the LHS nurse's office along with the completed parent section and signature.

FOOTBALL and CHEERLEADING- begin Monday, August 13, 2018

ALL OTHER SPORTS- begin Thursday, August 23, 2018

Where can I get the forms?

Go to <u>www.ledyard.net</u>. Click on the LHS tab, and then click the section "Athletics". You can find both the Health Assessment record and the Interim Sports form under this section.

- * Pick up the forms in the Nurse's office at LHS. Forms may also be found in the Main Office if we are out.
- * Your physician's office may have copies of the Blue Health Assessment record. You will need to get these to us.
- * The Return to Play is situation specific and may be required after an injury or illness. Contact the Nurse for info.



UCONN ECE Marine Science














Career Center News

Career Day 2018











On the morning of April 5th the hallways of LHS were busy with students in search for the first of three speakers they would be listening to for Career Day. Career Day is a portion of the school day devoted to career exploration where each student participates in 3 distinct classroom presentations. Students completed a survey in January to determine what types of professions interest them most. The Career Center then factors in where the labor demands are and recruit willing professionals that relate to the majority of students' interests. Students are then assigned to hear three speakers, each presentation lasts 25 minutes. Presenters provide information such as: how they came into their jobs; how high school academics relate; what higher education or training is required; what are the pros and cons of their professions; and what a typical day involves. Over 72 professionals joined us this year. Speakers included a veterinarian, landscape designer, marine medical professionals, biologist. enforcement, video game designer, graphic designer, social workers, a variety of engineers, middle school teacher, physical therapist, fitness instructor, pilot, attorney, welder, paramedic, firefighter, registered nurse, cosmetologist, construction project manager and many more.





Construction Rodeo Day 2018



On May 2nd some Ledyard Students and several teachers attended the Construction Rodeo Career Days at NLC (formerly Mountain Resort) in Wallingford, CT. After a safety brief each student received a backpack, safety goggles and a hardhat to keep. Students were given the opportunity to operate a skid steer, excavator and crane simulator; climb a United Illuminating utility pole; build a masonry wall; cut tile; solder; weld and use a variety of power tools and more! Representatives from several trade schools and apprenticeship programs were there giving information to students who were interested. This event is great for students who are interested in working with their hands and exposes them to tomorrow's careers in construction.

SUMMER EMPLOYMENT and VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Students who are looking for part-time and summer employment opportunities are encouraged to be proactive and approach businesses and ask them if they are hiring. I urge them to dress professionally, ask if they are hiring and to speak to a manager, give a strong handshake, make eye contact, fill out an application and follow up in a week or two. Don't wait for them to call you. By being assertive it shows enthusiasm. A brief resume is also a professional touch and it will make them stand out from other applicants. Naviance has a simple resume for students to use. If anyone would like help with a resume they are welcome to come to the Career Center for assistance. Volunteer opportunities are also available in the Career Center.

Students under 18 are reminded that they cannot start any job without first securing working papers (statement of age) from the school. In order to provide work permits, students must bring in a *Promise of Employment* from their potential employer. This Promise of Employment should be on company letterhead and should contain the job description, wage and be signed by a manager Working Papers are available in the Career Center (or Main Office from Mrs. Campo when school is not in session) along with a legal document with their birthdate. CT driver's license, drivers permit, military identification card, passport or birth certificate is acceptable. It is a good idea for students seeking working papers during the summer to call the main office in advance to make sure someone will be able to assist them.

There are also restrictions on hours and locations governing the employment of minors. This information is available in the Career Center or by visiting the Connecticut Department of Labor's web site: http://www.ctdol.state.ct.us and clicking on <Youth Employment>.

Students who are 14 and 15 years old should not be too discouraged when they are unable to secure work. They should be encouraged to pursue volunteer opportunities that will prepare them for future employment opportunities. Community service is a compliment to a young student's resume for work and for college. It is also a great way to give back to their community.

Employers often comment about the casual attitudes of youth in the workplace, specifically concerning attire, socializing and attitudes. Students are reminded that the workplace is the "adult world" and their behaviors should conform to the environment. Remember, all employers become references for future potential employers to contact. The Career Center is happy to assist students with job search skills, proper work application process, creation of resumes and interviewing skills.
